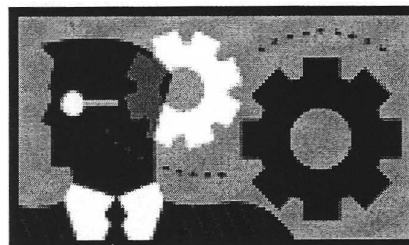

CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY & RE-ENTRY

The Correctional Facility offers an in-house program for anyone with an alcohol or substance abuse problem or for anyone interested in making some significant changes in their life. This program provides includes groups, meetings and aftercare referrals Assistance with Social Services for post release planning is now available. The program is staffed by credentialed counselors along with community agencies and operates in Mod A & Mod B. In the program you will be assigned a counselor. In other units, you will not have a counselor. Contact Craig Johnson if you are interested in the CD / Re-entry program.

EDUCATIONAL & VOCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

General education is available to all in the facility including the GED preparation and some additional courses. If you are under 21, you will be required to attend school with RCSD unless you already have your G.E.D. or high school diploma. If you are over 21, we encourage your participation. Please write Miss Twig if you have questions about any school activities.

Vocational programs are available for some. Feel free to write Miss Twig for information on these training and preparation programs.

PARKS & WORK ACTIVITIES

Supervised parks and opportunities to work around the building are difficult to get and result, in part, from your behavior in the housing unit, and your participation in school, programs and other work assignments. Write to Corporal Dianetti if you have any interest in the work programs.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT LEAVING the Monroe Correctional Facility --

1. Most people leaving have a number of needs. These may include housing, alcohol/drug or mental health treatment, educational/ vocational training and placement, and making lifestyle changes in order to not recommit.
2. The facility offers intensive programs to assist you in turning your life around, and to make a successful transition back to the community (in Mod A and Mod B)
3. If you are going to be on Probation, Parole, or if you have pending charges, it would be in your best interest to become involved in the programs while you are here (in Mod A and Mod B)
4. If you are applying for Local Conditional Release, which if approved, allows you to leave early and go on Parole for a year, it is in your best interest to be in the programs in Mod A and Mod B.
5. Counselors are available only to persons in Mod A or B (exception for females)
6. If you elect to enter the Mods, there will be an expectation for change, including being accountable and making positive plans for the future. Some people are not yet ready for this.
7. Case management and re-entry services are available for most people who are in Mod A and Mod B. These services can be of great help even after you leave.
8. If you are not in the program in the Mods, and you have needs for support, you will need to go to DHS at 111 Westfall Road when you are released and see what they can do for you. Ask the releasing Sergeant for a Jail Time Verification Form, and take that to DHS.
